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Stephens College fashion design students work throughout the school year to turn concepts into designs, and those designs into garments. Freshmen present some of their first creations, while sophomores showcase their new skills in patternmaking and draping. Junior and senior designers create garments for a range of categories including denim, weekend wear, contemporary sportswear and tailored designs and sustainability.

The Jury of Selection consists of a panel of industry leaders and business professionals who are responsible for selecting the highest quality, most inovative pieces to be highlighted in the fashion show, as well as selecting student winners in each category. Past jurors have included supermodel Karlie Kloss and alumna Brianne Ratliff '03 from Armani Exchange.

At Stephens College, where students learn by doing, you don't just read about the fashion industry, you experience it firsthand. Fashion Marketing and Management, Fashion Communication and Apparel Studies students are responsible for planning all details of the event; from the lighting and music down to hair and make-up. The Collections has been a successful event since 1944 and often sells out before the day of the shows.

This year's show marks the 75th anniversary of the student designer fashion show. To celebrate, we have invited three Stephens College alumna to present their collections. This show will also be featuring submissions from high school students. This show represents a celebration of past, present and future through the lens of this year's theme of "Liberation and Growth."

Maboroshi allows the consumer to appreciate the art that exists in repurposing old garments and fabrics. This collection is entirely upcycled, with the exception of the fabrics with prints that I designed myself. Upcycling garments, fabrics, and hardware allows them a new life, and can be passed down for generations.
