

### ABOUT THE COLLECTIONS




Each year at Stephens College, the fashion design students put in countless hours to create unique, one-of-a-kind garments and collections through meticulous research, design, and making. To showcase the incredible up-and-coming talent, Stephens College has been producing *The Collections*, the annual student designer fashion show for 78 years. Through planning and coordinating the public event and designing the clothing, the fashion show is 100% student-led, showcasing every student's talent, hard work, creativity, and leadership. *The Collections* allows our designers to finally watch their creations come to life.

Since its inception, The Fashion Program at Stephens College prepares students who learn from fashion industry leaders to become the next generation of talent. Begun in 1944, the Fashion Program was led by Muriel King, one of the first American fashion designers to achieve name recognition. Throughout the years since, the program has received many honors, such as being an official member of the Council of Fashion Designers of America (CFDA); ranking number 13 of fashion programs worldwide according to the London-based Business of Fashion: and joining the Fashion Scholarship Fund, an esteemed invitation-only scholarship competition. Another highlight of the Stephens Fashion Program, launched in 2016 by alumna Jeannene Thompson Booher, is the Fashion Lecture Series. The series has brought notable fashion industry leaders on campus to advise and inspire students. American designer Brandon Maxwell and English designer Zandra Rhodes are two notable lecturers. Providing firsthand experience and knowledge of fashion, the Stephens College Costume Museum and Research was established in 1958. The collection houses 13,000 historical garments in the Matilda Magnus Price Fashion Collection, including reputable designers Charles Worth, Claire McCardell, Oscar de la Renta, Dior, and Chanel.



#### **THEME**



The theme for the 78th annual *The Collections* fashion show is **Reflections.** For most of us, the past couple of years in a global pandemic have been nothing short of exhausting, painful, and rigorous.
